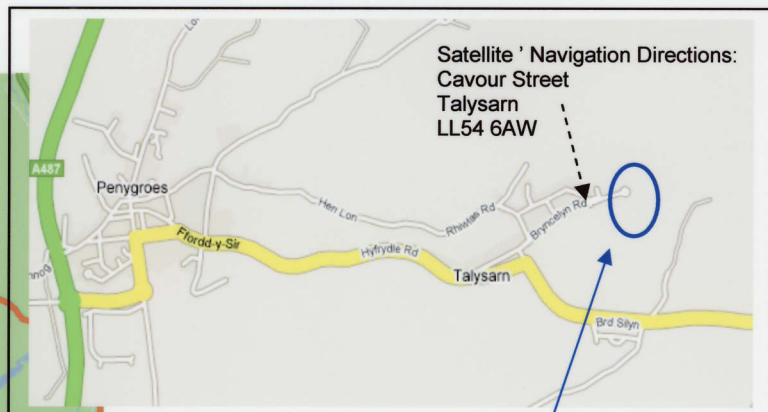
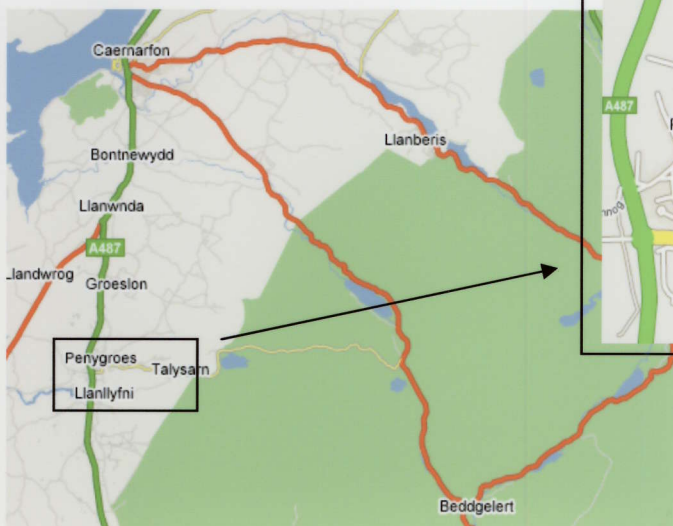
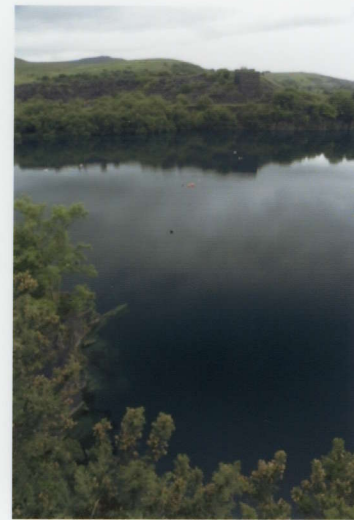
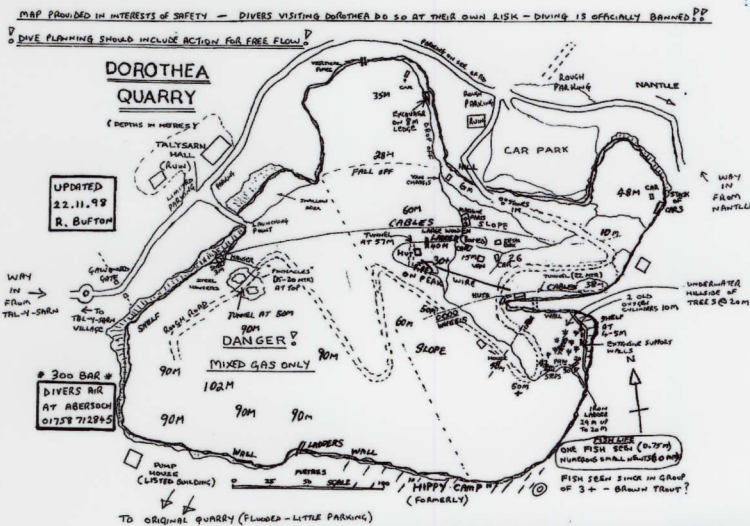


Dorothea Quarry Dive Site

WARNING

This dive site is a disused slate quarry in North Wales. The Landowner does not promote scuba diving, but the site is used regular by divers. The danger is that the water is over 100m deep and can be as cold as 5°C even in the summer. Access is via rough dirt roads, and can sometimes be blocked, giving rise to long strenuous walks. **Emergency support is not readily available.**

ProScuba do not promote recreational dives here. For experienced divers with the correct training this can be an ideal venue, but at their own risk



We normally meet at the end of this road. There is a small roundabout before turning into a dirt road. Park just along on here, careful not to block access.
